A sculptor of over 40 years, Lyman possesses a unique working knowledge of materials and their application. The past thirteen years he has primarily focused on creating wind sculptures that are fabricated out of copper, stainless steel, and steel. The result is a design that allows each sculpture to be responsive to the currents of the wind, allowing changing forms to emerge.
